#### Make 10

#### You will need:

- Game board
- A1-6 dice
- Two writing pencils
- Two different coloured pencils

## **How to play**

- Play with a partner. Take it in turns to roll the dice and write the number in one of the squares on the Game board.
- You can write two, three or more numbers in a square. You can write numbers in any square, even if there are numbers written in it by the other person.
- If you write a number in a square so that the total of the numbers in that square is now 10, you win that square. Ring it with your coloured pencil.
- The first person to ring three squares in a line, in any direction, wins!
